

Guidelines for Preparing Consent Forms

A Consent Form should include:-

- 1. Study Title.
- Name and contact information of the Investigators.
 If the Researcher is an Undergraduate or Postgraduate Student, contact information of his / her Faculty Advisor should also be presented.
- 3. A description of the procedure of the study in which the Participants will be asked to perform.
- 4. An estimation of the length of time for which the Participants will need to carry out the above procedure.
- 5. Information on potential discomfort or risk reasonably to be expected by the Participants.
- 6. An assurance that participation in the study is the result of voluntary decision by the Participants.
 - If the Participants are younger than 18-year-old, voluntary decision by the Participants' parents / guardians will be required.
- 7. An assurance that the Participants may withdraw from the study at any time without penalty.
- 8. An assurance that the Participants' person information (protected under law by the Hong Kong Personal Data Privacy Ordinance) will be used for research purposes only, and will NOT be given out to other parties unless requested by legal authorities.
- 9. Contact information for further inquiries and concerns about the study.

The research that you will be participating in today is part of a Chinese University of Hong Kong, Department of Psychology project conducted by Ms Student and supervised by Professor Mentor. The project investigates how we remember visual words.

During today's session, you will be asked to complete two task blocks. The first block will be a study block. You will see words one by one on a computer screen with the task to carefully attend to the words and to commit them to memory. During the second block, you will be shown the same words again intermixed with new words. Your task will be to decide for each word whether or not you have encountered it in the study block. You will indicate your decision by pressing a button on a keyboard.

The entire session should last about 30 minutes.

Experimental tasks can be cognitively demanding and you might feel some fatigue. No other discomforts are expected. The risks involved in this research are deemed ordinary and not different from the risks you encounter in normal day activities.

Your participation in this research is entirely voluntary.

You may withdraw from participation at any time without penalty. In this case, you will be credited for the duration of time you have participated. You may ask the experimenter to discard your data.
