

Abstract

504 LGB individuals in Hong Kong and Taiwan answered a self-created homonegative microaggression scale, the Measure of Daily Coping (Stone & Neale, 1984) and the Rosenberg Self-Esteem Scale (1965). The validity of homonegative microaggression scale is checked by content validity ratio and against discrimination experiences for construct validity. It displays a reliability of .90. It is also found that there is moderation effect on the effect of microaggression on self-esteem, and that Taiwanese experience more microaggressions than Hong Kongese.
